Mason at a Glance

George Mason University's short history is one of an enterprising and innovative pioneer, creating a major teaching and research university from a small, eight-room schoolhouse in just 50 years. George Mason began as the Northern Virginia branch of the University of Virginia in 1957. In 1972, Mason became an independent member of the commonwealth's system of colleges and universities. As Virginia's largest public research university, Mason is recognized as an innovative, entrepreneurial institution with global distinction in a range of academic fields, being named the number-one national up-and-coming university by *U.S. News & World Report* in 2012.

With strong undergraduate and graduate degree programs in engineering and information technology, dance, organizational psychology, and health care, Mason students are routinely recognized with national and international scholarships. Enrollment is more than 33,000, with students studying in 200 degree programs at the bachelor's, master's, doctoral, and professional levels.

Mason professors conduct groundbreaking research in areas such as cancer, climate change, information technology, and the biosciences, and Mason's Center for the Arts and the Hylton Performing Arts Center bring world-renowned artists, musicians, and actors to the area.

Mason has campuses in Fairfax, Arlington, and Prince William counties, and in Songdo, Korea. In addition, Mason operates a site in Loudoun County and has partnered with the Smithsonian Institution to create the Smithsonian-Mason School of Conservation in Front Royal, Virginia. The university also offers programs online and at the Center for Innovative Technology in Herndon.

- Mason offers more than 200 degree programs.
- Mason's student population is more than 33,000, 27,000 of whom are educated at the Fairfax Campus.
- Approximately two-thirds of our total student population are undergraduates, and one-third is graduate level or law school students.
- Eighty-two percent of our students come from Virginia, and 18 percent are from out of state.
- Our students come from 130 countries as well as the United States, forming a global community right on campus.
- Sixty-five percent of our students attend full time, and 35 percent attend part time.
- More than 6,000 students reside on the Fairfax Campus.
- Mason has more than 150,000 alumni.

Guests and visitors to the Fairfax Campus are strongly encouraged to park in a Visitor Parking area at the Mason Pond, Shenandoah, or Rappahannock River Parking Decks at the prevailing rates. Guests and visitors may also park at Pay by Space and Pay and Display parking areas or purchase a daily parking permit at the Fairfax Parking Services office located adjacent to the Shenandoah Parking Deck. If you are an annual member of the fitness facilities, then a General area parking permit is included with your membership. If you become a member for a few months (e.g., summer), then a General area parking permit can be obtained for \$15 with your membership. For those using the fitness facilities just for the day, a four-hour parking voucher is included in the guest fee for the Shenandoah and Mason Pond parking decks.

The Early Identification Program (EIP) is a free college preparation program, focusing on students who would be the first in their family to attend college. The program is not open to everyone. Students must be nominated by school personnel in the spring of their seventh grade year and selected to participate as eighth graders. Through academic enrichment programs, mentoring, parental involvement, and leadership workshops, students are equipped with the appropriate resources to succeed in college. Students who successfully complete the program and meet specific academic criteria are guaranteed admission to Mason. Several school districts in Northern Virginia, including Fairfax County, Prince William County, Alexandria City, Arlington County, Falls Church City, Manassas City, and Manassas Park City, are in partnership with EIP. The program is held at the Fairfax and Science and Technology Campuses.

Under the terms of the Senior Citizens Higher Education Act of 1974, eligible Virginia residents, 60 years or older with a taxable income not exceeding \$23,850 for Virginia income tax purposes, may enroll for credit in university courses through the Nondegree Studies Program without paying tuition. Senior citizens at least 60 years of age may register to audit courses for free regardless of income level.

Summer enrollment provides an opportunity for eligible undergraduate, graduate, and nondegree/transfer students to begin or continue the pursuit of their academic goals. The summer term comprises four standard sessions offered in abbreviated formats, as daytime and evening classes and as distance education courses.

Summer registration for current Mason students begins mid-March, while registration for nondegree students begins in late March to early April. Academically qualified high school juniors and seniors may also register for summer courses. Students who are new to Mason are required to apply and be evaluated for admission. George Mason University has five libraries: Fenwick Library and the Gateway Library at the Johnson Center on the Fairfax Campus, the Arlington Campus Library, the Mercer Library on the Science and Technology Campus, and the School of Law Library at the Arlington Campus. Combined holdings include approximately 1.4 million print volumes; more than 1.5 million electronic books; access to more than 133,000 print and electronic periodicals; 55,000 multimedia titles; 3.3 million microforms; and a broad array of more than 840 digital databases. In addition, the libraries are U.S. Government, Commonwealth of Virginia, and European Union document depositories, holding 215,000 cartographic materials, and possess approximately 250 unique or distinct special collections and archives. Library research

materials and other resources are available to the public for use on site; however, some online legal resources are restricted to university users at the School of Law Library. Circulating books may be borrowed by the public through the Library Passport Program, which requires a paid membership; this program does not include the Law Library.
